ANNUAL REPORT 2017

I have much pleasure in presenting for your consideration the 69th Annual Report and Financial Statements.

In my third year as your president the game continues to face the ongoing decline in our overall membership. I believe that this is not only an Indoor Bowls issue but a wider participation in sports issue with a greater variety of sports that are now available to people to participate in and the changing social environment that now exists within which we operate. Perhaps it is time to look at how we provide the game to players through the club structure and consider if there are alternative ways to provide access to the game of Indoor Bowls for people who do not wish to belong to a Club but do wish to participate in the sport.

NZIB continues to provide the many challenging National events that those who currently play the game look forward to each year and it continues to be a focus for the executive to ensure these events are well organised and provide the competition that the players expect.

Sport New Zealand has continued to provide us with a similar level of funding to past years and special thanks to their Investment Co-ordinator Craig MacFarlane for his help throughout the process. Our responsibility, to ensure that we continue to receive their support, is to provide the programmes that we have identified and provide evidence that these programmes are making a difference. The programmes that we have identified are; Coaching, Umpires, Competition Structure- National Events, International and Regional Events.

Changes were made last year to the umpire's exam which has enabled us to appoint several new umpires for the game. The work to train and test those who wish to become qualified umpires has been successful in increasing the number of Umpires registered with NZIB.

We have also held positive workshops for coaches but much more is required if we are to be successful in making a difference with our coaches. Local support and input is required. NZIB has proposed new initiatives for 2018 which we believe will support this programme.

Michelle Watt has continued to be involved as our Development Officer based in Taranaki. Thanks Michelle for your efforts in promoting the game to many schools in this area and providing opportunities for local clubs to become involved in growing the numbers in the greater Taranaki.

A New Zealand team has been organised to compete at an international Festival of Bowls event in England in May 2018. This is part of the programme to develop an international game. We look forward to positive results from this initiative.

As I stated earlier providing well run national events is a priority for the executive. Feedback and information is required from all districts to help NZIB provide the required evidence to Sport NZ to ensure we continue to receive their support.

I had the pleasure of managing the NZ team that competed for the Henselite Trophy in Sydney in May. All players performed well during the test and deservedly beat Australia 41-25. Thanks to all the players and supporters who made the trip.

I would like to thank Nelson for their efforts in organising and running the 40th South Island Championships. A well run event enjoyed by all.

Special thanks to Waikato, in association with the Lake Taupo Club, for another successful national's held at Taupo. While there were some comments on the condition of the floor the nationals again were enjoyed by all who attended. Special mention also to the Taupo District Council for their generous support of this event.

Thanks to those districts that hosted the South Island team as they toured the lower North Island, the Bay of Plenty district for hosting the North v South match, Waikato for hosting the Welch Trophy and all those districts that hosted national events during the year. Without your support in organising the behind the scenes activities for catering, umpires, venue etc they would not be the success that they are. Your district's efforts are appreciated.

On behalf of all bowlers I extend our condolences to all members who have lost loved ones during the year.

In particular I would like to mention George Anderson from Hawkes Bay who served on the Executive from 1988 – 1993 the last three years as Treasurer.

International – Sydney

66th Welch Trophy – Hamilton

Auckland won the Welch Trophy for the eighth time in an extremely closely fought encounter with the result being in doubt right up to the final round of pairs.

Final Standings were Auckland 107.5; North Taranaki 102; Tauranga 91.5; Upper Hutt Valley 85.5; Southland 80; Canterbury 73.5.

Auckland had not won this prestigious trophy for a decade, so the victory was very sweet and greeted with great jubilation. Auckland had won the Welch Trophy seven times since its inception in 1952 in 1963, 1964, 1975, 1982, 1984, 1992 and 2007 prior to that. Three of the players who won in 2007 Paul Wright and Rodney Mills as well as Patrick Morrison who was the reserve that year were in the team.

DEVELOPMENT ADVISOR'S REPORT

In six years of being in this role, every year there has been so many changes, I have to say that it has been another successful year for the sport in Taranaki and Whanganui regions.

Every year we cover so many schools doing indoor bowls as part of their school sport, this includes the largest intermediate in New Plymouth now having an academy group that practises twice a week for two and half terms. The Merrilands Club adopted this school and through the program that I am delivering in the Taranaki region. The club independently organises practises and coaching with only a small help now from me when required, there will be a run on affect with their membership growing in time at club level.

During the South Island tour I was invited to travel with the team as part of my position for development within the sport. I visited regions and talked with bowls centres and members to see what is going on in their area for sport. The biggest feedback was not every bowler knows what is happening within our sport and all information still isn't getting to the grass roots players. How effective are your local meetings for the everyday bowler? Is every club having their feedback or information talked about at centre level. Not everyone is wanting to know about the top teams they just want the sport continue on for the next few years with good numbers and events. I believe that if there are good structures in each regional committee that region will continue to grow for years.

In 2017 I continued to do delivery in schools in Taranaki and Whanganui regions with 108 sessions and 3920 students taking part in lessons, events and programs. Every year we continue to provide events after delivering sessions to schools. That is one way to sell this sport into the schools if there is a cross over in competition with over schools. We have repeated delivery in some schools as there is more interest from these schools and find that some people do go on to be members within our sport.

I have been in this role for six years and every year it has gone through changes from mainly delivering to Taranaki schools to now helping Wanganui Centre and other centres, building on the officials for each centre which includes more umpires for everyone and having more information getting to the grass roots of the game. I inform anyone holding an exec position that they should also upskill with more knowledge to build their organization to be the best and attend courses locally, as things change all the time and people need to continue to be up to date with their positions.

I continue to enjoy this position and what NZIB has planned for the coming year. Thank you to all the volunteers out helping grow this sport and hope to see you all return next year.

During the year NZIB ran three more “Coaching the Coaches” workshops. The first was in Counties with the second one in Palmerston North followed by Balclutha.

The idea for these workshops was to coach members who would be Club Coaches and give them some new skills and ideas that they could then use. The informal sessions also achieved the aim of encouraging questions and interaction from the attendees which is considered important. All three workshops were well attended and positive feedback was received. Club appointed Club Coaches that attended the workshops were presented with a “Club Coach Badge” at the end of each session.

It is disappointing that some districts have not yet appointed a district coach and it is hoped that this will be done at your district's next AGM or meeting. NZIB considers this position as an important link so that communication can be more direct. It is also felt that some districts have a person in the position but they are unsure and do very little. This needs to change. The aim is to get a good working database of coaches that can share ideas.

The focus for 2018 will be to continue with some workshops, but to carry on with the NZ Sport “Pathways” with the promotion of a model for a Regional Coach position and evaluate how it can successfully work with District Coaches. Once this position is operating well the desire is to roll out and expand into other regions.

UMPIRE'S REPORT

National Examiner Nigel Warnes has reported he was pleased with the progress that had been made this year with the National Examination. The multi answer theory paper and more flexibility with sitting days has been popular and of the 35 who have sat the exam 27 had been successful in becoming National Umpires. Some districts are benefitting from this more than others who have ignored the fact that their numbers are declining. These districts will be approached next year and offered help to train umpires as it is essential for the sport that all districts have a good supply available to officiate at their many fixtures.

It is noticeable and rewarding that now at National Championships more umpires are making themselves available. This could well be because they will be recognised financially with the refund of their entry fees if they do sufficient sessions! In Taupo several new younger umpires showed great enthusiasm and their standard of umpiring was excellent. However there is still an issue of lack of umpires when there is only one playing session which needs to be addressed.

There has been discussion with some umpires about changing their uniform to a polo shirt but it is felt that the current uniform was much more official looking and appropriate. In future all umpires in action at National events will be requested to wear the official uniform.

Districts are reminded that they should all be having Umpire refresher courses at the beginning of each season.

Indoor Bowls would not survive without Umpires and NZIB would like to thank all Umpires and Measurers for their dedicated contribution throughout the year. Congratulations again to the newly qualified National Umpires and we wish you all well with your umpiring future.

1. Statement of Accounting Policies

Reporting Entity

The special purpose financial statements presented here are for New Zealand Indoor Bowls Incorporated. New Zealand Indoor Bowls Incorporated is an incorporated body established for promoting and administering indoor bowls in New Zealand.

Basis of Preparation

The annual report is a special purpose financial report that has been prepared in order to meet the requirements of the Incorporated Societies Act 1908 and for the benefit of New Zealand Indoor Bowls Incorporated's members.

Measurement Base

The financial statements of New Zealand Indoor Bowls Incorporated have been prepared on an accrual basis and are based on historical costs.

The information is presented in New Zealand dollars, rounded to the nearest whole dollar.

Changes in Accounting Policies

The External Reporting Board removed authoritative support from "old NZ GAAP" for all year ends with periods beginning on or after 1st April 2015. Having given consideration to its ongoing financial reporting requirements, the society reports using a special purpose basis going forward in accordance with the policies set out above and below. There have been no changes in accounting policies as a result of the transition to a special purposes basis of reporting, and no changes in the format in which the comparative figures are presented.

Specific Accounting Policies

a) Fixed Assets & Depreciation

The entity has the classes of fixed assets as shown on the Schedule of Fixed Assets and Depreciation. All fixed assets are recorded at cost less accumulated depreciation.

Depreciation of the assets has been calculated for at a rate intended to write off fixed assets over their useful lived as follows:

d) Taxation

New Zealand Indoor Bowls Incorporated is exempt from income tax in terms of section CW46 of the Income Tax Act 2007, as a body promoting amateur games or sport.

e) Income

Capitation and affiliation fees are recognised when received. Grant funding is recognised on an accrual basis to match the funding period.

f) Interest Received

Interest income is recorded on an accrual basis.

2. Audit

These financial statements have been audited.

3. Contingent Liabilities

At balance date there are no known contingent liabilities (2016: \$nil).

4. Securities & Guarantees

There was no overdraft as at balance date nor was any facility arranged.
