ANNUAL REPORT 2016

Ladies and Gentleman

It is with pleasure that I present for your consideration the 68th Annual Report and Financial Statements.

The second year of my term as NZIB President has reinforced my thoughts from my first year as President with the many and varied challenges that the game faces to survive, as well as continue to provide the many challenging competitions that those who participate in the game have come to expect.

The outcome of our funding application with Sport New Zealand to receive a similar level of funding was welcomed. However we are required to achieve some significant outcomes with that funding that will also require input from all districts and members to ensure expectations are met. This is especially so in respect of training coaches and umpires. Changes were introduced this year to the Umpires examination process and initial steps were taken on coaching in districts. We look forward to further developments on these in the New Year. Both of these activities require your support to ensure that the programmes are successful and funding is maintained from Sport NZ.

The appointment of Michelle Watt as an NZIB Development Officer in Taranaki following the withdrawal of Sport Taranaki support is another initiative that we have continued with. Further evaluation will be undertaken to ensure that the returns to the game justify the costs.

The South Island Championships hosted by South Otago in Balclutha were a resounding success. The ability of one of our smaller districts to host this event proves that with some dedication and commitment from the locals it is possible to hold these events outside the main centres. Well done South Otago.

Congratulations to Tauranga for hosting a very successful Nationals event. The Masters continues to receive increased support and has added a new interest for some to return to the Nationals.

Thanks to all those districts that hosted the North Island Team as they travelled the South Island this year. The island tour is seen as an opportunity to promote the game amongst local members. Well done to Southland, South Canterbury and Ashburton who took the opportunity to have some time interacting with the North Island team. Unfortunately we were unable to participate in the activity planned by Canterbury due to the teams' late arrival in Christchurch.

Thanks to Canterbury for hosting the North/South Test match and the Welch Trophy. It was pleasing to be able to get back to your facility following a long and arduous process to reinstate your hall.

I would also like to thank all those local officials and volunteers that assisted in hosting National events during the year.

International - Sydney

NZ Team nomination forms have been distributed and the Team will be named at the Annual General Meeting. There will be a compulsory training camp on 8-9 April 2017 for all team members and reserves.

An official invitation to attend the 2018 Festival of Bowls, which would include an additional International event involving other European countries, has been received. In the Open Event 354 players competed in the singles, 211 teams competed in the pairs, 137 teams in the triples and 110 in the fours. In the Master Events 168 players competed in the singles, 104 teams competed in the pairs, 50 teams in the triples and 43 in the fours.

The Tournament produced some memorable moments that included Mike Phipps, Tauranga becoming the second player to win the new '10' Gold Star for ten national titles when he and Grant l'Ami from Tauranga won the pairs title for the third year in a row. Both were presented with the new '10' Gold Star badge Grant having won his last year.

Sport New Zealand

This year Sport NZ introduced a new Community Sport Strategy and all National Sporting Organisation were required to submit investment applications judged on the value of helping them to achieve their goals. NZIB was pleased to be given a grant of \$64,000 for the next four years. During this time evidence must be given to show good coach and umpire development as well as enhancing national events and the delivery of International and Regional competitions. It is imperative these outcomes are achieved if the sport is to continue well into the future.

We would like to record our thanks to Sport NZ for their continued support of this organisation and in particular our Relationship Manager/Investment Coordinator Craig MacFarlane.

UMPIRES REPORT

Deputy President Nigel Warnes took over the role as National Examiner and immediately set about reviewing the whole examination process. As a result a multi answer theory section has been introduced and well received. Unfortunately the planned DVD on Mat Faults has taken longer than expected but should be in place for next season.

Having the option of sitting the Examination in either the first week of May or August has proved popular and this year over 20 new National Umpires have been appointed. These new umpires should be supported and encouraged so that they gain experience and confidence and serve our game well into the future.

The incentive of refunding Umpires entry fees to the National Championship if they umpire a certain number of sessions proves to be popular. However having enough Umpires to cover the triples and fours qualifying days when there is just the one session continues to be a problem.

Districts are reminded that they should all be having Umpire refresher courses at the beginning of each season.

Indoor Bowls would not survive without Umpires and NZIB would like to thank all Umpires and Measurers for their dedicated contribution to the game.

DEVELOPMENT ADVISOR'S REPORT

What a year 2016 was for my role, the first few months everything was in place for success. In July, my employment with Sport Taranaki stopped along with a few other sports from a change of direction within the trust. NZIB wanted to see the job continue in Taranaki and Whanganui regions and assist any other region that requires help. On the 8th July, the new chapter started and hasn't looked back. With Sport NZ, they are always looking at changes and this role will continue to change. With change bring opportunities for bowling members to upskill and learn new skills within our sport.

My role has gone from delivering every day in schools to some delivering and more work done in opportunities for upskilling officials, umpires and coaches. As well more work done with sporting organisations that will give our sport more opportunities in the communities we live in and grow our sport in positive way

In 2016 there were many successes for my role. May was the annual Secondary school event which moved to the TSB stadium and numbers increase by 50% and next year this could double with all the work happening at the moment within secondary schools. The clusters we run had also doubled in numbers, which goes to show if all the clubs supported the programmes that are delivered in their area they could grow their memberships.

A few years ago, before this role was even created, I wanted to create an Intermediate School Indoor Bowls tournament. I was told "you're joking, it won't work" and "what school would be interested in bowls in schools".

In 2016 I was so pleased to hold a tournament with 66 teams from all around the Taranaki region and have schools wanting more bowls in their curriculum, more than anyone would have expected. Roll on next year with more opportunities for both centres in Taranaki.

Looking to the future of 2017, there is lots of plans happening for coaches, officials and Whanganui schools which will grow. I hope that other regions take the step and build a better future for our sport, otherwise the next generation won't have indoor bowls to play. Look out for any updates in NZIB website, Facebook or even at your local centre/club meetings.

Even with the season finished this becomes my busy time with planning and sorting 2017 out. I hope every bowler enjoys their time off and next year brings them more opportunities and members.

COACHING REPORT

The 2016 season has seen a number of changes with the focus on our coaching structure being one of the main areas. The need to set clear pathways and development opportunities for our coaches is important and was one of the key initiatives outlined by NZIB in the Sport NZ funding application. It is now up to districts and clubs to support the new Coaching plan so the game benefits and the evidence of success can be provided to Sport NZ.

There are already club coaches and district coaches out there, but there hasn't been a national standard or any clear standard or guidance for the coaches.

So the plan going forward is to have workshops that all coaches or interested members who want to be coaches can attend. These will be held over three years, two of which were held in 2016, at least four to be ran in 2017 with a further four/ five to be run in 2018.

The idea of the workshops is to bring likeminded people together and form a network of ideas that can be used as a coach and to also try and breakdown some of the negative thoughts of some members believing that the game doesn't need coaches. The workshops include a session on how to coach a new player to the sport, and this is done by having a member of the public that has never played before attend and be coached during the workshop. All aspects of coaching from a novice up to helping out the more experienced player will be included.

NZIB has already asked that all Districts have an appointed District coach who can then assist to ensure all their clubs have coaches. Once this has been achieved the possibilities of Regional and a National coach follow with conferences where ideas and skills can continue to grow within the sport.

The two workshops in 2016 were both run at the top of the South Island with very good support and these also include some tips to new players and plenty of opportunity for all to ask questions and to share ideas. Names and email address of those that attended have been kept and once we have completed next year's workshops, we will start to send out all the ideas that have been mentioned.

In 2017 two of the workshops will be held in the North Island and two in the South.

This year has been the year of the Google Spreadsheet.

From the National Championships to the Welch Trophy, and nearly everything in between, this fascinating technology has enlivened awareness of our sport at the highest level, and almost made the job of Publicity Officer redundant.

It has made it possible for bowlers to follow the progress of events in an immediate and accurate manner and also made more up to date coverage possible on our website and Facebook.

It has also made the Publicity Officer's job much easier as there is no longer the dependency on phone, text or email message to put together coverage for District Publicity Officers and the News Media.

It will still be necessary to have some-one to translate what Google provides to a form suitable for media use and DPOs may still wish to have the same service. These are matters for the NZIB Executive to consider.

During the year previews have been prepared for every national event, for both the media and DPOs. They have been followed by running coverage of the events, and wrap-up reports. While I have not received a lot of feedback I have received some media inquiries for more information, as well as requests to arrange interviews and photographs so we are not completely neglected.

I enjoyed good relations with the Tauranga media during the Nationals, continuing the trend of past years.

Google came into its own with the Nationals, the South Island Tour, and the Paterson and Welch Trophies. The latter in particular proved a thrilling contest on which I was able to deliver almost "blow by blow" coverage.

Particular attention was also paid to the North Island and National Secondary School Championships as well as the AIMS Games. For many young bowlers these are the gateway events to serious top-level competition and I believe it important to both encourage the young bowlers through publicity, and also see that everyone else is aware of their activities.

One aspect of my role that provides much enjoyment is gathering and compiling material for the Daily Bulletins at the Nationals. It adds an extra dimension to the event.

This report brings to an end four years as Publicity Officer. With technology developing at a rapid rate I believe the time to be right for someone to bring a fresh approach to the role, although I am willing to help where possible in the future.

I wish to thank all the NZIB Executive members for their backing and encouragement, to Executive Officer Ngairé Drake for her support, and to former Publicity Officer Delwyn Hughes for filling in the gaps in my knowledge and other useful advice.

I wish the Federation well in the future and hope our sport continues to prosper.

I will keep it in my plan moving forward, but it's unlikely I will get this implemented before next season, knowing what my own personal schedule is like over the next 3-4 months. on a new design.

1. Statement of Accounting Policies

Reporting Entity

The special purpose financial statements presented here are for New Zealand Indoor Bowls Incorporated. New Zealand Indoor Bowls Incorporated is an incorporated body established for promoting and administering indoor bowls in New Zealand.

Basis of Preparation

The annual report is a special purpose financial report that has been prepared in order to meet the requirements of the Incorporated Societies Act 1908 and for the benefit of New Zealand Indoor Bowls Incorporated's members.

Measurement Base

The financial statements of New Zealand Indoor Bowls Incorporated have been prepared on an accrual basis and are based on historical costs.

The information is presented in New Zealand dollars, rounded to the nearest whole dollar.

Changes in Accounting Policies

The External Reporting Board removed authoritative support from "old NZ GAAP" for all year ends with periods beginning on or after 1st April 2015. Having given consideration to its ongoing financial reporting requirements, the society will report using a special purpose basis going forward in accordance with the policies set out below. There have been no changes in accounting policies as a result of the transition to a special purposes basis of reporting.



Specific Accounting Policies

a) Fixed Assets & Depreciation

The entity has the classes of fixed assets as shown on the Schedule of Fixed Assets and Depreciation. All fixed assets are recorded at cost less accumulated depreciation.

Depreciation of the assets has been calculated for at a rate intended to write off fixed assets over their useful lived as follows:

f) Interest Received

Interest income is recorded on an accrual basis.

At balance date there are no known contingent liabilities (2015: \$nil).

4. Securities & Guarantees

There was no overdraft as at balance date nor was any facility arranged.
