Obituaries

On behalf of all bowlers I extend our condolences to all members who have lost loved ones during the year.

Events

It has been another busy and successful year starting out with the New Zealand team having a hard-fought victory over the Australians in early

May. Our congratulations go out to the victorious Mat Blacks team and the Southland District for hosting what could only be described as one of the best run International events that has ever taken place. A special mention must also go to Graham Low and his dedicated team.

The South Island Champs and the Henselite Singles were hosted by Canterbury this year and both were a great success. Well done Canterbury your new facilities and your hosting skills are up with the very best.

The Nationals were hosted by Bay of Plenty in Rotorua at the Energy Events Centre and once again turned out to be a wonderful event. With the holding of the Northern and Southern Academy and Masters, the District challenge and the local forum, made the Nationals a full-on event. I would say that the National event with the Masters included is once again turning into a great occasion for a holiday and a chance to catch-up with old friends and make new acquaintances. A special thanks must go to BOP and the many dedicated volunteers for the smooth running of this tournament. I look forward to seeing you all in Whangarei next year.

I would like to take the opportunity to thank all those Districts that hosted the South Island touring team this year. To those Districts that used the opportunity to help promote the sport in their area, well done, as this is just as important as the bowls themselves and is a valuable 'tool' when used in this way.

To Counties who hosted the North vs South match and the Welch Trophy this year, what a great effort and a special thanks to Matt and his hard-working volunteers for a brilliant job.

Another special mention must go out to all those people who give up their time and efforts to do the live streaming of these events. I know everyone is starting to rely on this for what is happening but am not sure they realize just how much time some people are putting into this and at what cost. And so, on behalf of everyone I would like to say thank you for bringing bowls into our homes and offices, keep up the good work.

This year we introduced the 1-5 Pairs and the Masters fours as something new. Although not everyone got behind this at the start, it did however turn out to be very popular with those that played in it and hopefully in the following years it will grow into something a lot bigger like the Masters at the Nationals. I encourage all Districts to get behind these events and hold some tournaments along the same lines in their areas next year, and to try and encourage new and different players out of the clubs and into the District scene. To Nelson who held the 1-5 Pairs and ran it themselves, what an outstanding result, thank you and to Roskill and Districts who hosted the Masters, another outstanding success and thanks to Ross and his team for their contribution.

Financial & Partners

The financial accounts for the year while showing that we have operated under budget, reflect a year end deficit of \$45,500. This is due mainly to a \$25,000 (54%) reduction in Gaming Trust funding and a \$4,369 (5%) decline in membership revenue.

We cannot allow these trends to continue as we move forward. A start has been made with the introduction of Kevin Wilson to the team; he brings 26 years of leadership and governance experience in the sport and recreation sector. It will be his job, along with your support to bring good governance and leadership to all Districts and Clubs, commencing with a NZ-Wide interactive-workshops early 2020. "If you fail to plan, you plan to fail" this is a fact. NZIB, Districts and our Clubs now have a Strategic plan for moving ahead. This is on the new website that was set up this year.

The new website is 'work in progress' and will be updated and modified as we move forward. We plan is to make this a key 'communications platform' for you our members, our partners and the public at large.

I would like to take the opportunity to thank all those who have provided us with support be it financial or in kind over the past 12 months. In particular I wish to acknowledge Sport New Zealand, our National Guardian of Play, Active Recreation and Sport system in Aotearoa New Zealand, who have provided guidance and wise counsel along with financial support for the game. I also wish to acknowledge our major sponsor Summerset who have once again been a key partner. Their support is greatly valued by all involved in Indoor Bowls... thank you.

The Gaming Trusts, the NZ Community Trust, Rotorua Energy Charitable Trust, and the NZ Racing Board also supported bowls with grants during the year. Henselite also continued their long standing association with the Henselite Champion of Champions event. Their support has made a difference and is greatly appreciated.

Looking to the future, the combination of the introduction of the Masters fours and the 1-5 Pairs along with hopefully the change in the way we collect affiliation fees will help the Districts go out to all the unaffiliated players and encourage them to renew their affiliation back to NZIB. An increase in participation from this group of players would have a farreaching positive impact on the game. It would on the one hand help Districts with entry numbers and fees, while on the other, it would help NZIB with membership numbers hence making applications for funding and sponsorship easier with numbers on the increase. I'm sure more discussion on this will be had and I encourage all of you to think about this and look at a better way forward.

Tributes

A special tribute must be acknowledged this year to three long serving people who will be standing down at the conclusion of this season.

Ngaire Drake who has been the CEO and the hub of New Zealand Indoor Bowls for 27 years has finally decided enough is enough (I think really, she has just got 'Cruise Boat' fever). I cannot give her enough praise for what she has achieved over these years and how much extra effort she has put into our sport. She has been loyal, honest and above all dedicated to making the sport a success and on behalf of everyone we wish you well going forward and thank you from the bottom of our hearts for the time we have had from you.

Delwyn Hughes our publicity officer for 29 years is hanging up her keyboard and letting someone else have a turn. She has been inspirational and deeply informative in her reports and has kept us all up with the play as it has happened. Delwyn has offered to assist and pass on the information she has to whoever takes her job. This is of no small offer and shows the dedication she has given over the years. I know we will all miss her and wish her all the best. I'm sure this is not the last time we will hear from her and thank her on behalf of you all.

Paul Voorend who has been our Webmaster for the last 5 years and given his time freely to keeping it up to date. This is no small task and we thank you for the effort you have put in. We would all like to wish you well on your new endeavor's and hope all goes according to plan, thanks.

70th Summerset National Championships - Rotorua

This event was hosted by the Bay of Plenty Centre at the Rotorua Energy Events Centre, Government Gardens, Rotorua

Highlights included Lorraine Phipps, Tauranga becoming the first woman to win a National Championship Gold Star and Grant l'Ami becoming the first player to win 15 titles and a third Gold Star. Grant l'Ami and Mike Phipps combined to win the Open Pairs for the fifth time together and then won the triples with Lorraine.

In the Masters Events women won both the singles and pairs for the first time.

In the Open Events 300 players competed in the singles, 180 teams competed in the pairs, 120 teams in the triples and 100 in the fours. In the Masters Events 185 players competed in the singles, 120 teams competed in the pairs, 65 teams in the triples and 45 teams in the fours.

Alex Reed took on a Development/ Coaching role in the upper part of the North Island. He had some success at attracting some new groups from both schools and from outdoor bowls clubs. He also visited some clubs that hadn't been great supporters of district events and looks like just by attending their club nights and offering some support if they wanted it has had a little bit of success. We need to remember that with development/ coaching it's not always about new players or school children, it's about all our current members as well.

In the Counties area, Michael McPharland continues to work with the schools and this year over 400 students have enjoyed his sessions. It is a credit to him and his helpers that he continues to show the desire to reach out to the schools and has the success that he does.

The South Island team attended three different development/ coaching sessions which were successful in their own way. In Tauranga they went to a school that was already involved with the Aims games and had a very enjoyable mix and mingle and played some bowls. In Waikato they went to a school and worked with some children that were new to the game and showed them the basics that are required for the game. Then in North Taranaki, they were at a session which involved them to play games with young and old players that were all in their early years of our game.

North Taranaki have also taken on Michelle Watt in a new role. It is great to see a district look at trying something new and we are sure that with her passion for the game, Michelle will continue to build on the work that she has already done in schools in the area.

Down in Balclutha, Peter Carnie ran a different type of workshop that was again well attended. The workshop was based on different types of skills required and had those that attended move around several different types of skills and activities.

NZIB understand there will be many other activities going on and would love to hear about them all.

For now, we say thank you to all the club and district coaches and their many other helpers around the country.

1. Statement of Accounting Policies

Reporting Entity

The special purpose financial statements presented here are for New Zealand Indoor Bowls Incorporated. New Zealand Indoor Bowls Incorporated is an incorporated body established for promoting and administering indoor bowls in New Zealand.

Basis of Preparation

The annual report is a special purpose financial report that has been prepared in accordance with the accounting policies disclosed and in order to meet the requirements of the Incorporated Societies Act 1908 and for the benefit of New Zealand Indoor Bowls Incorporated's members.

Measurement Base

The financial statements of New Zealand Indoor Bowls Incorporated have been prepared on an accrual basis and are based on historical costs. The information is presented in New Zealand dollars, rounded to the nearest whole dollar.

Changes in Accounting Policies

There have been no changes in accounting policies. All policies have been applied on a basis consistent with those of the previous reporting period.

Specific Accounting Policies

a) Property, Plant & Equipment

The entity has the classes of fixed assets as shown on the Schedule of Fixed Assets and Depreciation. All fixed assets are recorded at cost less accumulated depreciation.

Depreciation of the assets has been calculated for at a rate intended to write off fixed assets over their useful life as follows:

Capitation and affiliation fees are recognised when received. Grant and sponsorship funding is recognised on an accrual basis to match the funding period.

Sponsorship income is recognised when the invoice is raised.

Equipment sales are recognised then the associated purchase of equipment invoice is raised.

Interest income is recorded on an accrual basis.

h) ANZ Credit Card

The ANZ credit card has a limit of \$8,000. The amount utilised at year end is \$425.00 recorded in Trade & Other Payables.
