

Covid-19 was only something we had heard about overseas and it seemed to be one of those things that wouldn't affect our lives here in New Zealand. But it did, and it hit us hard.

It seems a long time ago when we started to cancel events throughout the country. NZIB were always hopeful that there would be some bowls played and decided to push back as many dates as possible.

Masters Fours, Paterson and Welch Trophies were all cancelled along with the Island Tour and of course our flagship event, our Nationals. These events were cancelled early due to the guidelines put out by the Ministry of Health and our Government

Throughout this year NZIB have had to make decisions for the betterment of our sport while also taking responsibility for the safety of our members.

Once out of lockdown it was clear that most districts were looking to play indoor bowls at some level. We have been very fortunate that our sport has been able to run some of our National events and in many cases this has been a welcome distraction for those that have been affected in any way by Covid.

We are all aware that there have been many opposed to any bowls going ahead, but it has always come down to everyone having a choice of playing or staying at home and no-one should judge anyone else's personal choice.

Thank you to the districts that have held our National events this year, North Wellington, Wairarapa Canterbury and Upper Hutt Valley. To all the members in these districts that have helped a very big thank you especially the umpires who always give up their own time so that everyone else can enjoy the game.

In March this year we saw our long serving Executive Officer, Ngaire Drake, retire and, as we have done already, we thank her for all the work and service she has given our sport.

It had been decided to split her role into two parts, one being administration based and the other being someone to deal with sponsors and the likes of Sport New Zealand.

We then contracted Bowls New Zealand to take on our administration duties and they appointed Helen Stallard to be our key contact. Helen has worked very hard this year and we thank her for the job which has been all over the place this year.

Kevin Wilson was also employed to take on a role with us but sadly Kevin chose to resign from the position in April.

Our 2019 elected President, Nigel Warnes, also chose to resign in February this year after serving many years on the executive. Nigel has been one of the driving forces for many of our new concepts over the years, and I'm sure he will still make a valuable contribution to our sport in the coming years.

We also had a new publicity officer in 2020 and I'm sure you will agree that Teri Anderson has done a tremendous job and has added some new concepts with a fresh look at publicity.

We all need to be aware that our sport is at a major cross-roads (if not for sometime already) and we all need to take a look at what we are and can do to rebuild. This may call for a change and we need to be prepared that we won't always get it right, but without change, our sport will continue to struggle nationally as well as at district and club level.

NATIONAL PUBLICITY OFFICER'S REPORT

Firstly, a big thank you to Delwyn Hughes for handing over an impressive archive of results, and thank you also to the District Publicity Officers for being co-operative and easy to work with, particularly regarding stories for the monthly newsletter.

With limited bowls over the lockdown period, two online quizzes were run to stimulate interest as well as an online bowls challenge. Newsletters during this time focused more on 'getting to know' our members.

Due to COVID-19 a lot of national events were not played, but events that were played and covered include: the New Zealand Junior Singles, Secondary School Singles and Pairs, 1-5 Year Pairs, Henselite Singles, Mixed Pairs, Interisland Test Match and the Island Championships. Previews and summaries of these events were posted on Facebook and on the New Zealand Indoor Bowls website, as well as emailed to all district publicity officers for their distribution.

All national events have had exceptional live-streaming coverage through the Sky Sport Next YouTube channel, thanks to N-tech and The Pits Media. Full credit to NZIB executive for organising this.

Although reaching out to multiple news outlets with our stories – for example, Stuff, Herald, Kapiti Observer - there was zero response. However local publicity officers were successful in getting newspapers to publish stories – for example, Gisborne, Bay of Plenty and Marlborough.

In the upcoming season, as well as getting details of the local publicity officers, I will also ask for their go-to contacts for any media outlets, or encourage them to get in contact with media outlets. Coverage of events has been fantastic within the bowls community; now the goal is to promote indoor bowls as much as possible outside of the bowling community.

LIVE STREAMING

It is a sign of how sports broadcasting is evolving that we include a report on live streaming of indoor bowls. Gone are the days where people would have to wait for a phone call or newspaper report or even a website update on results from event. Now, broadband internet access and streaming coverage mean that interested parties can view events live from anywhere in the world – we have seen this particularly with our bowling friends in the UK and Australia tuning in.

Whilst live streaming has been happening in a variety of forms over Facebook for a few years, things have certainly stepped up when NZIB entered an agreement this year with the Waddell Group for broadcasting of the Junior Singles and NZ Secondary Schools event. Basically, this provides the national body with a sum of money to engage a provider to record an event(s) to a high standard such that it can be played live on a Youtube/Sky Sport feed and have the potential for it to be edited and rebroadcast on Sky TV channels.

A group called N-Tech were engaged to stream the Junior Singles and NZ Secondary Schools events. This was a steep learning curve for both parties as N-Tech were completely new to our sport but we were very pleased with the quality of the broadcast and the positive feedback received from the viewing community. As a result, the Executive extended the arrangements to include the 1-5 Year Pairs, Henselite Singles and Mixed Pairs finals. It will be interesting to see whether or not and how the agreement with the Waddell Group can be developed moving forward.

In 2019, the Trans-Tasman test had been covered by a group called Pits Media who have extensive experience in Speedway broadcasting. Such was the quality of their package of that event that they were asked to provide a similar product for the recent Island test match in Christchurch

Pits Media and N-Tech are just two of the partners or potential providers. Plans were made to work with Bowls New Zealand for some events through our relationship with them but Covid enforced lockdowns dealt to that for 2020. We also have a keen and emerging provider within our sport's community in the Matside group who of course bring a strong level of understanding of the game and availability for many events, such as the Island Championships. They also provide regular, good quality coverage of Waikato events.

A huge thanks must go to all of these providers for their willingness to work with New Zealand Indoor Bowls to promote our sport to the bowling community and wider afield. We are also grateful to the various people who have volunteered (or been conscripted!) to provide commentary at the events we have covered in 2020, your willingness to give of your time, enthusiasm and knowledge has been appreciated.

As an Executive, we look forward to exploring future possibilities in this sphere in 2021 and beyond.

SPORT NZ

Sport NZ is a crown agency with a responsibility for promoting and supporting quality experiences in play, active recreation and sport at all levels. NZ Indoor Bowls adopted an NSO Partnership Investment programme with Sport NZ four years ago, which included funding for ongoing administration of our sport. The outbreak of the Covid-19 coronavirus has had a major effect on our sport and NZIB is appreciative of the support, advice and resources available to assist in developing our 'Guidelines for Play' at the various alert levels. A number of Districts and Clubs affiliated to NZIB have also taken advantage of the financial support available through the Government funded Community Resilience Fund.

As a result, NZIB has now initiated a closer relationship with Sport NZ and has a clearer understanding of the resources at our disposal, both nationally and locally (Regional Sports Trusts), to assist our sport transition, not only in the short, medium and long term recovery process, but also for the future of our sport.

The Sport NZ Strategic Plan for the period 2020 - 2024, is 'focussed on tamariki (ages 5 to 11) and rangatahi (ages 12 to 18) based on the understanding that by improving the quality of experiences that tamariki and rangatahi have, there is greater chance of them establishing a life-long commitment to, and involvement in, play, active recreation and sport'.

The challenge for NZIB is to ensure a sustained commitment to utilising the services available from Sport NZ as defined in our 2020-2021 Investment Plan.

Independent auditor's report

Opinion

Other than our capacity as auditor we have no relationship with, or interests in, New Zealand Indoor Bowls Incorporation.

1. Statement of Accounting Policies

Reporting Entity

The special purpose financial statements presented here are for New Zealand Indoor Bowls Incorporated. New Zealand Indoor Bowls Incorporated is an incorporated body established for promoting and administering indoor bowls in New Zealand.

Basis of Preparation

The annual report is a special purpose financial report that has been prepared in accordance with the accounting policies disclosed and in order to meet the requirements of the Tax Administration (Financial Statements) Order 2014 and for the benefit of New Zealand Indoor Bowls Incorporated's members.

Measurement Base

The financial statements of New Zealand Indoor Bowls Incorporated have been prepared on an accrual basis and are based on historical costs. The information is presented in New Zealand dollars, rounded to the nearest whole dollar.

Changes in Accounting Policies

There have been no changes in accounting policies. All policies have been applied on a basis consistent with those of the previous reporting period.

Specific Accounting Policies

a) Property, Plant & Equipment

The entity has the classes of fixed assets as shown on the Schedule of Fixed Assets and Depreciation. All fixed assets are recorded at cost less accumulated depreciation.

Depreciation of the assets has been calculated for at a rate intended to write off fixed assets over their useful life as follows:

22. Covid-19

On 30 January 2020, the spread of novel Corona virus (COVID-19) was declared a public health emergency by the World Health Organisation. From 25 March 2020, New Zealand was placed into Alert Level 4 lockdown to combat the pandemic, for a minimum period of four weeks. From 28th April 2020 this was reduced to Alert Level 3 with some restrictions relaxed, for a period of two weeks. From 13 May 2020 this was reduced to Alert Level 2, with lockdown restrictions further reduced. From 9 January 2020 this was reduced to Alert Level 1, with domestic lockdown restrictions removed.

The Board will continue to monitor the impact of COVID-19 on the entity but at the date of signing this report the Board does not believe the entity has been or will be adversely financially affected by the pandemic. The known and expected impacts of the virus on the entity include:

- Several National competitions were cancelled,
- NZ Indoor Bowls applied for and received \$7,030 in wage subsidies for one employee as part of the Ministry of Social Development's COVID-19 Wage Subsidy Scheme. \$5,273 oft his was refunded.

The Board maintain the view that NZ Indoor Bowls has sufficient resources that it will continue to operate as a going concern provided operational targets are met.
