

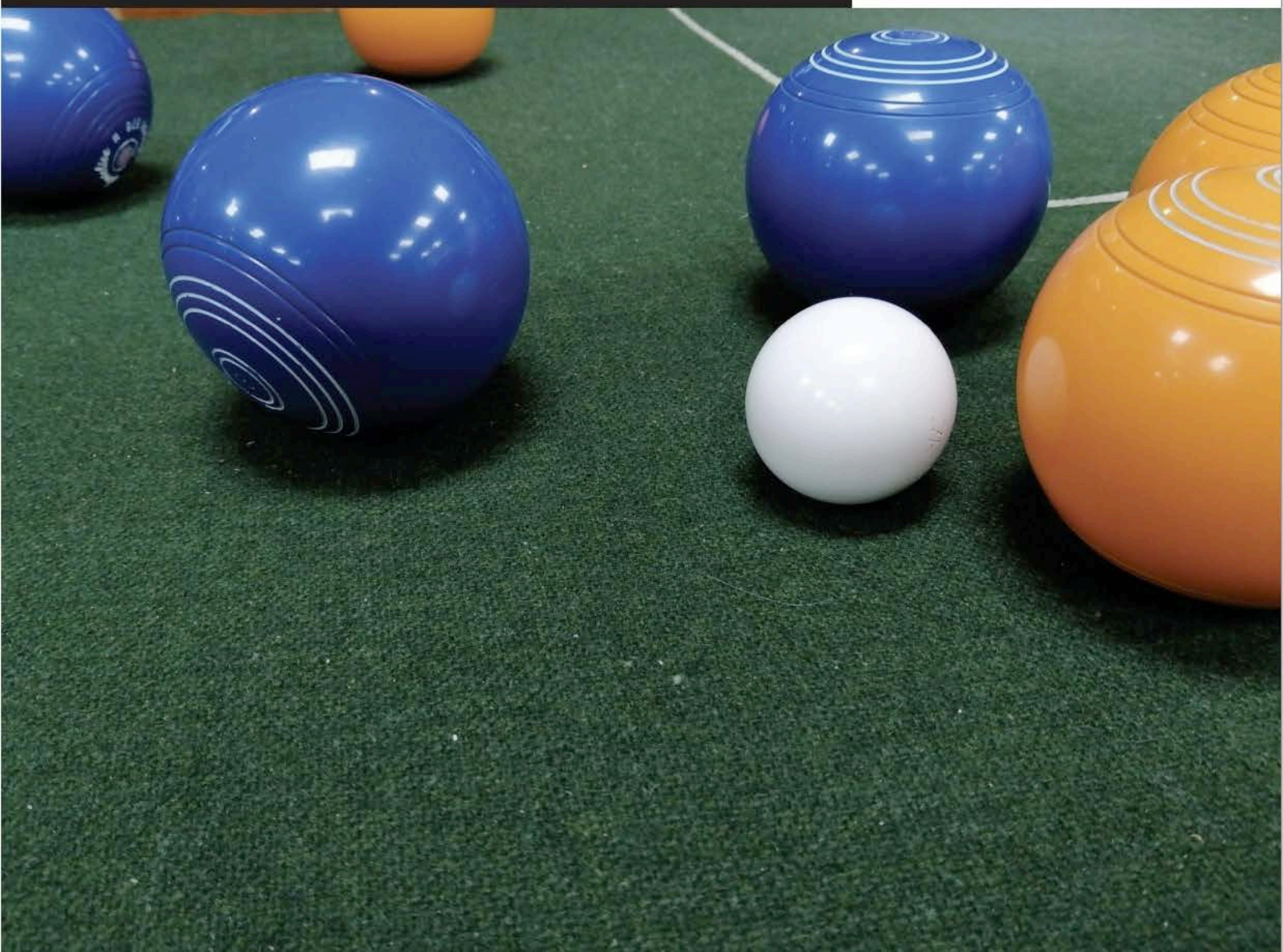

Our funding will take a large hit as we go from \$64,000 to only \$15,000 per year. This alone is a big enough hurdle for us without the issues like our dropping membership.

Publicity was again carried out by Teri Blackburn and again she has done a great job. I am pleased that she has agreed to carry on in this role for the 2022 season.

I have enjoyed my year as President but do struggle when some of our members seem to only focus on the winning of events and what they will get for this. I believe that we need to look at acknowledging more people for what they have done in the game, not only on the mat.

LIVE STREAMING

Live streaming continues to be an important area of growth for our sport, as a way of involving more people from a spectator point of view, but also as a vehicle to ideally encourage new participants into our sport.

This year we have provided the following live streaming at events

- National Championships
 - o Singles – Streaming by Matside
 - o Pairs, Triples, Fours, Academy & Masters – Streaming provided by Bowls NZ to the Sky Sport Next Channel
- North V South Test Match – Streaming provided by Pits Media.

Unfortunately due to Covid the remaining events we planned to cover were postponed.

Of the events we did cover we would like to thank Matside for their continued support in providing great coverage.

The Feature Mat used in all post section rounds at the Nationals was well received and provided continuous coverage on these days. The staggering of semi finals to allow coverage of both Open and Masters events was also well received, and we will look to continue this going forward.

The Bowls NZ coverage to Sky Sport Next was very good, but would not have been possible without the many volunteers who help with production and commentating over the week, and we thank them for their help.

The Sky Sport Next coverage provided over the last 2 years has been excellent, however going forward there is a high level of uncertainty around this continuing. All agreements for NZ Sports Collective come to an end at the end of this year, including our agreement with Sky. We do now have confirmation from Sky that their involvement and investment will not be the same in Sky Sport Next (if at all). They have been going through major restructures and Covid19 has drastically changed the game when it comes to the money available.

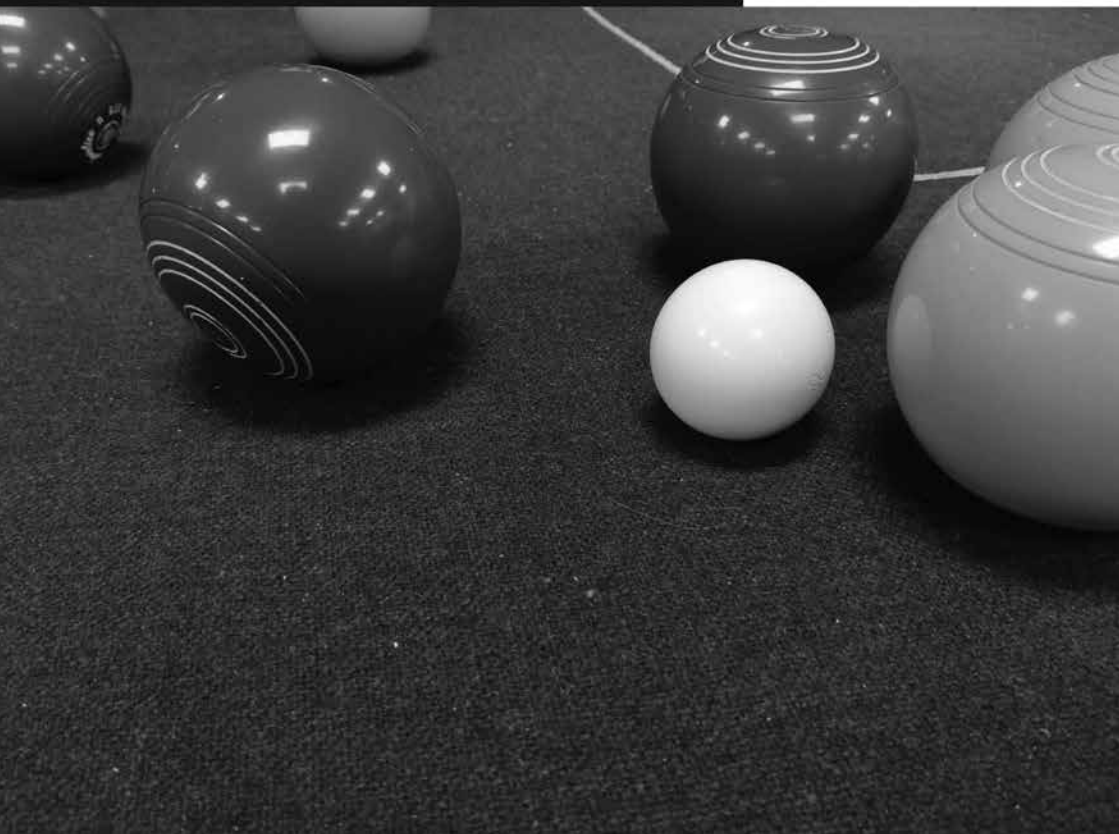
We continue to liaise with the Waddell Group who are motivated to explore all opportunities and ensure we have contingencies in place. These plans include generating revenue through the School Sport Sponsorship programme and the possibility of Sport NZ involvement to help sports accumulate greater reach and engagement. They are also currently talking to other broadcast and media companies about options and to determine whether they could be complementary to the relationship with Sky or standalone agreements.

Regardless of what happens with Sky Sport Next, NZIB is committed to live streaming as a promotional and support tool for the future. Of course, the more Streaming we provide the more the spectators demand from the coverage, and we continue to listen to these and look at how we can continuously improve.

Independent auditor's report

To the Members of New Zealand Indoor Bowls Incorporation

Opinion

We have audited the special purpose financial statements of New Zealand Indoor Bowls Incorporation on pages 4 to 14, which comprise the balance sheet as at 30 September 2021 and the statement of profit or loss, and statement of changes in equity for the year then ended, and notes to the special purpose financial statements, including a summary of significant accounting policies.

In our opinion, the accompanying special purpose financial statements of New Zealand Indoor Bowls Incorporation for the year ended 30 September 2021 are prepared, in all material respects, in accordance with the accounting policies set out in the statement of accounting policies of the special purpose financial statements.

Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audit in accordance with International Standards on Auditing (New Zealand) (ISAs (NZ)). Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the 'Auditor's responsibilities for the audit of the special purpose financial statements' section of our report.

We are independent of New Zealand Indoor Bowls Incorporation in accordance with Professional and Ethical Standard 1 (Revised) 'Code of ethics for assurance practitioners' issued by the New Zealand Auditing and Assurance Standards Board, and we have fulfilled our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with these requirements.

We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our opinion.

Other than our capacity as auditor we have no relationship with, or interests in, New Zealand Indoor Bowls Incorporation.

Emphasis of Matter: Basis of Accounting and Restriction on Distribution and Use

Without modifying our opinion, we draw attention to Note 1 to the special purpose financial statements, which describes the basis of accounting. The special purpose financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the Tax Administration (Financial Statements) Order 2014. As a result, the special purpose financial statements may not be suitable for another purpose. Our report is intended solely for New Zealand Indoor Bowls Incorporation and its Board and should not be distributed to parties other than New Zealand Indoor Bowls Incorporation

Board's responsibilities for the special purpose financial statements

The Board are responsible on behalf of New Zealand Indoor Bowls Incorporation for the preparation of these special purpose financial statements in accordance with the Tax Administration (Financial Statements) Order 2014 and for such internal control the Board determine is necessary to enable the preparation of special purpose financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

In preparing the financial statements, the Board are responsible on behalf of New Zealand Indoor Bowls Incorporation for assessing New Zealand Indoor Bowls Incorporation's ability to continue as a going concern, disclosing, as applicable, matters related to going concern and using the going

concern basis of accounting unless the Board either intend to liquidate New Zealand Indoor Bowls Incorporation or to cease operations, or have no realistic alternative but to do so.

1. Statement of Accounting Policies

Reporting Entity

The special purpose financial statements presented here are for New Zealand Indoor Bowls Incorporated. New Zealand Indoor Bowls Incorporated is an incorporated body established for promoting and administering indoor bowls in New Zealand.

Basis of Preparation

The annual report is a special purpose financial report that has been prepared in accordance with the accounting policies disclosed and in order to meet the requirements of the Tax Administration (Financial Statements) Order 2014 and for the benefit of New Zealand Indoor Bowls Incorporated's members.

Measurement Base

The financial statements of New Zealand Indoor Bowls Incorporated have been prepared on an accrual basis and are based on historical costs. The information is presented in New Zealand dollars, rounded to the nearest whole dollar.

Changes in Accounting Policies

There have been no changes in accounting policies. All policies have been applied on a basis consistent with those of the previous reporting period.

Specific Accounting Policies

a) Property, Plant & Equipment

The entity has the classes of fixed assets as shown on the Schedule of Fixed Assets and Depreciation. All fixed assets are recorded at cost less accumulated depreciation.

Depreciation of the assets has been calculated for at a rate intended to write off fixed assets over their useful life as follows:

b) Goods & Services Tax

These financial statements have been prepared on a GST exclusive basis with the exception of accounts receivable and accounts payable which are shown inclusive of GST.

c) Receivables

Receivables are stated at their estimated realisable value.

d) Payables

Payables are recognised at fair value and represent the amount outstanding by New Zealand Indoor Bowls to its suppliers and employees at balance date.

e) Taxation

New Zealand Indoor Bowls Incorporated is exempt from Income tax in terms of section CW46 of the Income Tax Act 2007, as a body promoting amateur games or sport.

f) Income

Capitation and affiliation fees are recognised when received. Grant and sponsorship funding is recognised on an accrual basis to match the funding period.

Sponsorship income is recognised when the invoice is raised.

Equipment sales are recognised when the associated purchase of equipment invoice is raised.

g) Interest Received

Interest income is recorded on an accrual basis.

2. Audit

These financial statements have been audited.

3. Contingent Liabilities

At balance date there are no known contingent liabilities (20120: \$nil).

4. Securities & Guarantees

There was no overdraft as at balance date nor was any facility arranged.

21. Covid-19

On 30 January 2020, the spread of novel Corona virus (COVID-19) was declared a public health emergency by the World Health Organisation. From 25 March 2020, New Zealand was placed into Alert Level 4 lockdown to combat the pandemic. In the months following, and up to the date the financial statements were authorised for issue by the board, the country has cycled in and out of various Alert Levels, some of which have included further lockdowns and restrictions on citizen movement and activities for extended periods.

The Board will continue to monitor the impact of COVID-19 on the entity but at the date of signing this report, the Board does not believe the entity has been or will be adversely financially affected by the pandemic. The known and expected impacts of the virus on the entity include:

- Several National competitions were cancelled,
- NZ Indoor Bowls applied for and received \$7,030 in wage subsidies for one employee as part of the Ministry of Social Development's COVID-19 Wage Subsidy Scheme. \$5,273 of this was refunded.

The Board maintain the view that NZ Indoor Bowls has sufficient resources that it will continue to operate as a going concern provided operational targets are met.

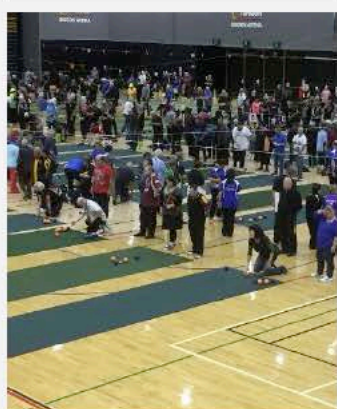
