

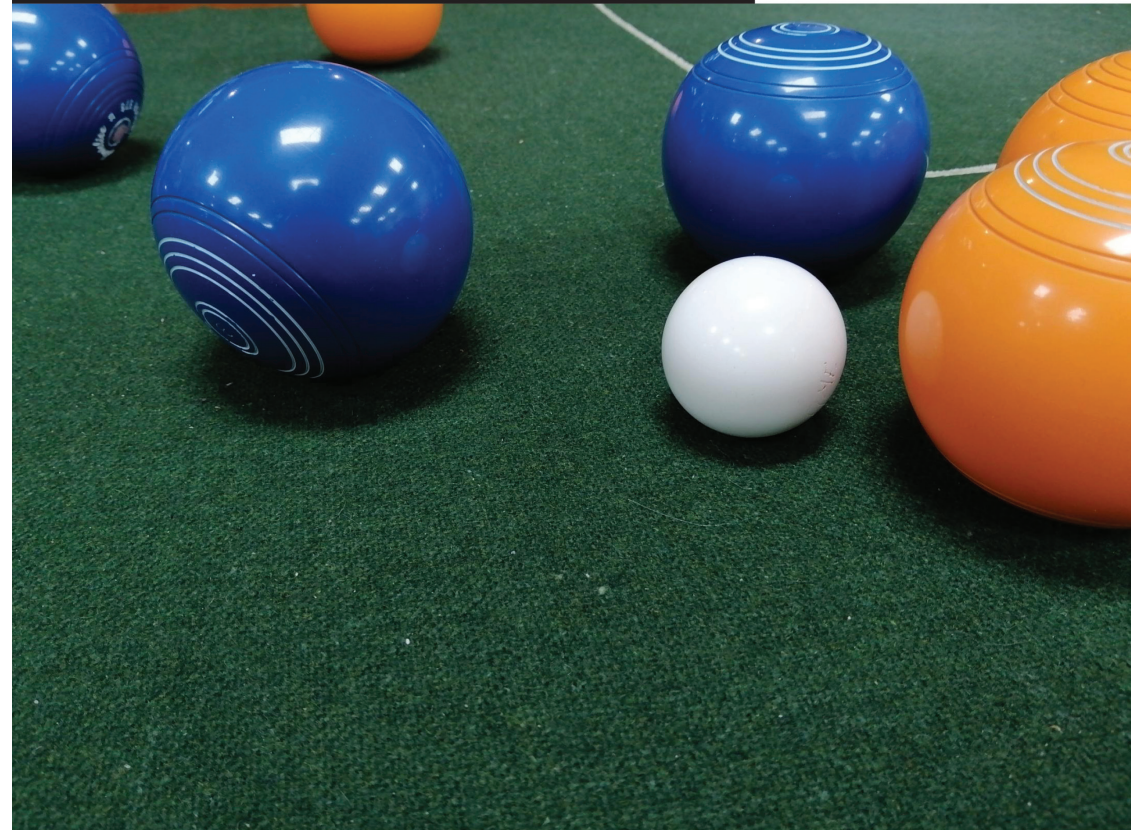

This award is awarded for consistent, continued and entirely voluntary efforts to promote our sport.

Not only do they dedicate a lot of time to playing our sport at a high level but they also hold a number of offices between them at Club and Centre level. They have also embarked over the past few years in bringing our sport to the masses through visual media. Through their efforts they have presented our sport to literally thousands of people who would otherwise have no notion of our sport.

All this is done in their quiet and humble manner.



Matside looks to continue to improve on all aspects of its production.

Improvements and Investments that were made this year:

- New Teltonika Industrial 4G Modem, and Outside Antenna
- Network Switch to bring all hardware together
- 4 x Commentator Headsets
- Second viewing Monitor and connections
- Scoreboard Improvement
- Upgraded to 100 gig Vodafone 4g Chip (Streaming takes approx. 2G per Hour)
- Travel Cases (For easier lifting and protection of the equipment)
- Set up a second channel, being Youtube when Facebook cap of 8 hours is reached.

We believe we have our Production capability somewhere where we are now happy with, and have potential to further upgrade the switcher to accommodate more cameras etc.

The ongoing frustration is simply the Live Stream Itself given the locations of the Bowling Halls/Stadiums and them not having adequate High Speed Wired Fibre. The new modem and Antenna provided a much-improved Live feed from Christchurch, Upper Hut and Ballarat with just a few nervous moments Live but mostly went good, however venues such as Invercargill and Waikato Halls have dead spots for 4G Internet. Christchurch previously did not have a good live feed but the Antenna now makes Live Streaming there possible. We are also considering the STARLINK RV service (SpaceX Satellite). Whilst recording and replaying events later is an option, it is 100% clear our viewers prefer Live footage.

Events covered by Matside during 2022 were:

- Super Weekend (2021 replay) from Christchurch (up to 1700 views per game)
- South Island Championships from Invercargill (up to 1200 views due to recorded coverage)
- North v South Test Match from Upper Hutt (up to 4500 views per round)
- NZ v Australia from Ballarat Victoria (up to 6100 views per game)
- Super Weekend from Upper Hutt (up to 2600 views per game)
- Welch Trophy from Hamilton (up to 1600 views due to interrupted coverage)

The Highlight for us had to be the International Test Match from Ballarat, as not only was our Live Stream stable for the most (being in a whole other country had its own challenges!), but also the feedback from a large number of viewers was fantastic and encouraging.

For next year, we look forward to working again with NZIB. We will have a full-time production person available for all NZIB events, including the National Championships in New Plymouth if required, and now have a wide number of people who can operate the Matside gear, and commentate.

Matside streams to its own Facebook Page that has over 1200 members, and it is shared from there to the NZIB and District Pages as appropriate.

Into the new year, Matside will set up a business account so it can provide official Quotes for events and potential equipment upgrades for the purpose of NZIB being able to apply for grants as it does now for other streaming services. However, as per previous years, Matside is a volunteer non-profit organisation set up to serve the sport of Indoor Bowls.

Once the 2023 NZIB Calendar is done, Matside would like to get confirmation on what events NZIB would like it to cover it can be locked into our Diaries, the team booked in, and the pre-planning and liaising with Stadiums etc can be done well in advance of the event.

Matside thanks Helen from NZIB for arranging travel for us when we have not been attending the events personally, and also the Hall Controllers and organisers who work in really well with us with our setting up, and with the Scheduling of TV games etc.

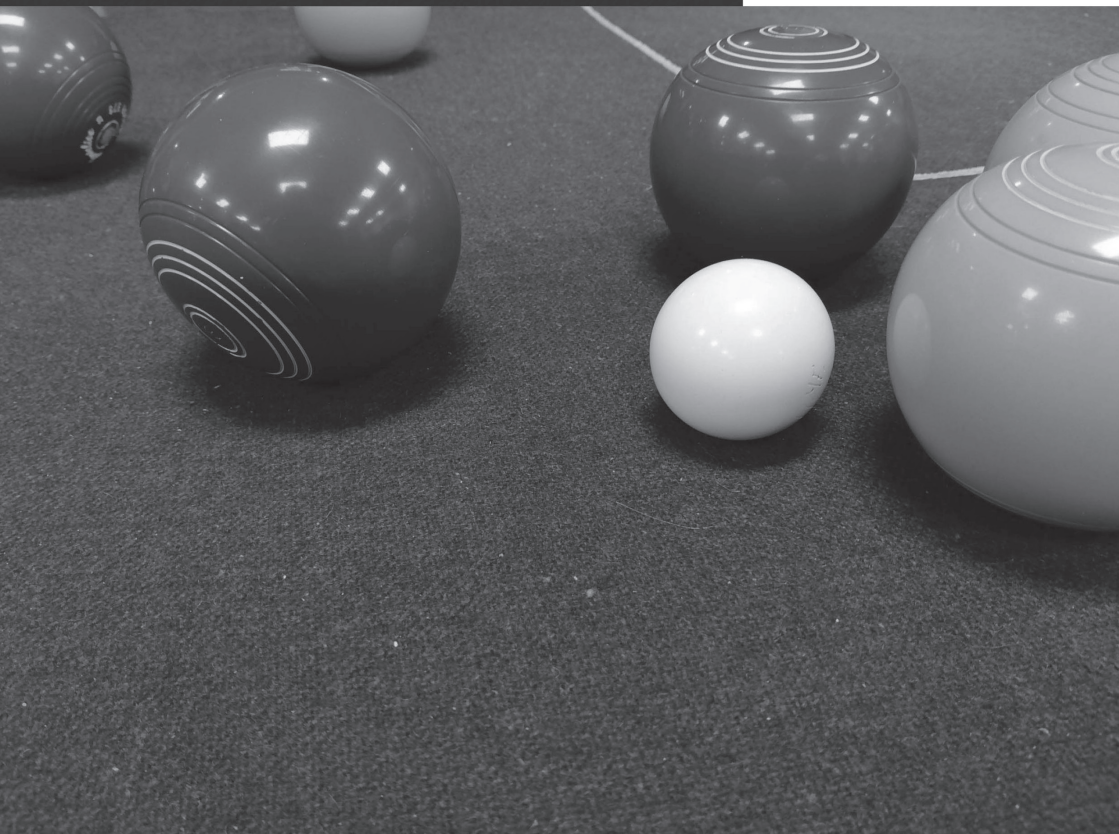

Statement of Movements in Equity




New Zealand Indoor Bowls Incorporated For the year ended 30 September 2022

1. Statement of Accounting Policies

Reporting Entity

The special purpose financial statements presented here are for New Zealand Indoor Bowls Incorporated. New Zealand Indoor Bowls Incorporated is an incorporated body established for promoting and administering indoor bowls in New Zealand.

Basis of Preparation

The annual report is a special purpose financial report that has been prepared in accordance with the accounting policies disclosed and in order to meet the requirements of the Tax Administration (Financial Statements) Order 2014 and for the benefit of New Zealand Indoor Bowls Incorporated's members.

Measurement Base

The financial statements of New Zealand Indoor Bowls Incorporated have been prepared on an accrual basis and are based on historical costs. The information is presented in New Zealand dollars, rounded to the nearest whole dollar.

Changes in Accounting Policies

There have been no changes in accounting policies. All policies have been applied on a basis consistent with those of the previous reporting period.

Specific Accounting Policies

a) Property, Plant & Equipment

The entity has the classes of fixed assets as shown on the Schedule of Fixed Assets and Depreciation. All fixed assets are recorded at cost less accumulated depreciation.

Depreciation of the assets has been calculated for at a rate intended to write off fixed assets over their useful life as follows:

b) Goods & Services Tax

These financial statements have been prepared on a GST exclusive basis with the exception of accounts receivable and accounts payable which are shown inclusive of GST.

c) Receivables

Receivables are stated at their estimated realisable value.

d) Payables

Payables are recognised at fair value and represent the amount outstanding by New Zealand Indoor Bowls to its suppliers and employees at balance date.

e) Taxation

New Zealand Indoor Bowls Incorporated is exempt from income tax in terms of section CW46 of the Income Tax Act 2007, as a body promoting amateur games or sport.



f) Income

Capitation and affiliation fees are recognised when received. Grant and sponsorship funding is recognised on an accrual basis to match the funding period.

Sponsorship income is recognised when the invoice is raised.

Equipment sales are recognised when the associated purchase of equipment invoice is raised.

g) Interest Received

Interest income is recorded on an accrual basis.

These financial statements have been audited.

3. Contingent Liabilities

At balance date there are no known contingent liabilities (2021: \$nil).

There was no overdraft as at balance date nor was any facility arranged.

22. Covid-19

On 30 January 2020, the spread of novel Corona virus (COVID-19) was declared a public health emergency by the World Health Organisation. From 25 March 2020, New Zealand was placed into Alert Level 4 lockdown to combat the pandemic. In the months following, and up to the date the financial statements were authorised for issue by the board, the country has cycled in and out of various Alert Levels, some of which have included further lockdowns and restrictions on citizen movement and activities for extended periods.

The Board will continue to monitor the impact of COVID-19 on the entity but at the date of signing this report, the Board does not believe the entity has been or will be adversely financially affected by the pandemic. The known and expected impacts of the virus on the entity include:

- Cancellations occurred in the 2021 year. No wage subsidy was received in the 2022 year. (2021: \$5,273). The Board maintain the view that NZ Indoor Bowls has sufficient resources that it will continue to operate as a going concern provided operational targets are met.
