

NORTHLAND'S JUNIOR DEVELOPMENT DAY **TOURNAMENT A GREAT SUCCESS**



The Northland Indoor Bowling Centre in conjunction with Sport Northland held a very successful Junior Development Day in Whangarei for teams from

Intermediate and Secondary Schools throughout Northland.

This is the fourth year of the tournament and each year has seen the numbers grow. This year about 150 children participated.

Eighteen teams entered from 7 Intermediate Schools, and twenty teams from 8 Secondary Schools. Nineteen mats were played on and each mat had a local indoor bowler supervising and keeping the score. It didn't matter if children lined up along the edge of the mat to watch, or if players changed places each end in some teams. The aim of the day was to have fun and enjoy the game. Clubs in the area have benefited with new members already.

Because of the popularity of the day it has been decided that for next year the tournament may be held over two days, one for Year 9 and over (secondary pupils) in May and one for the Year 7 & 8's in August. Winners received trophies donated by the Whangarei Indoor Bowls Association.

So popular is the day that a carload from Kaitaia travelled for two hours to participate and this paid off as they won the Year 7 & 8 section. Even the Whangarei members are excited about the day and the organisers have no trouble getting volunteers. In fact they are offering their help weeks before.

Garry Flewitt, the master of indoor bowls has achieved another milestone in his illustrious career by winning his 20th Otago title last month. He teamed up with Burnside club mate, Barry Cadogan to comprehensively take out the Otago Pairs Championship. In winning his 20th title Garry has now equalled the record with Kevin Darling, well known in indoor and outdoor bowls circles for his achievement in both sports.


