DEFENDING CHAMPIONS ALL ENTERED IN THE NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS

Mat Black Ashley Diamond from Upper Hutt Valley will defend the singles in the 68th National Indoor Bowls Championships to be held at the Taupo Events Centre, AC Baths Road, Taupo 10th to 17th June.

All of last year's champions have entered. Grant l'Ami and Mike Phipps, Tauranga will defend the Open Pairs, Paul Smith, Geoff Coughey and Keith Setter, Tauranga the Open Triples and Lloyd Bellis, Kath Arvidson, Rhonda Bellis and Debbie Warren, Nelson the Open Fours.

The North Taranaki crew that dominated the Masters Events last year at Mount Maunganui are all back. Andrew Brunton will defend the Singles and Fours with Brian Hardgrave, Bari Oliver and Maureen Dravitzki. Hardgrave, Oliver and Dravitzki will defend the Triples. Tauranga's Roger and Maureen Bartosh will defend the Pairs. Entries are similar to those at Mount Maunganui last year with Open Events attracting 315 Singles, 195 Pairs, 125 Triples and 105 Fours and in the Masters Events 200 Singles, 115 Pairs, 65 Triples and 45 Fours. The Masters Events are up on last year as they continue to grow in popularity which compensates for the lower



numbers in this year's Open Events.

Nelson Indoor Bowls celebrated its 60th birthday by hosting a Progressive tournament at its bowls stadium in Stoke, which also kicked the new season off. Prior to start of play Margaret Fraser was given the honour of cutting the 60th birthday cake after a speech by Linda Carrick, who was Nelson's first and only woman president. Carrick is also one of Nelson's longest serving officers having served as secretary for 10 years. She noted that the Wakapuaka Club, who celebrated their 60th birthday last year, is the only surviving club that was part of the inaugural meeting that created the Nelson Indoor Bowls Association body way back in 1956. Carrick also acknowledged some Nelson indoor bowlers who have made their mark on the sport, including the late Horace Warnes who not only served on the NZ Indoor Bowls Federations' board but who also donated the current home stadium in Stoke to the sport. The late Ian Fraser also served on both the NZ Federation and the NZ Umpires Association boards. Kay Forsyth and Norm Eden are two surviving life members of the Nelson Association with Forsyth still very active with bowls and earned her life membership last year.
